As Chairman of the Governor's Commission on Asian Pacific American Affairs, I would like to welcome you to the Commission's 2006 Annual Report.

This past year brought several important changes to the Commission. During 2006, Mr. David Lee became our Executive Director. Mr. Lee has brought renewed vigor and stability to the office operation. To better serve our community, we have restructured the Commission's subcommittees from three to four. This enables the Commission to focus on changing community needs such as education and health. We have also filled vacant positions with highly qualified Commissioners. The new Commissioners have brought unique expertise and diversified community perspectives to our Commission operation.

HISTORY AND MISSION

The Governor's Commission on Asian Pacific American Affairs ("Commission") was established on June 25, 1992 by Executive Order 01.01.1992.14 and later re-authorized and re-constituted by Executive Order 01.01.2003.27. The commissioners are appointed by the Governor, with members representing the major Asian Pacific American population groups in the State. Commissioners are appointed for four-year terms. The Chair of the Commission is designated by the Governor from among the members of the Commission.

The Commission advises the Governor's Office on Asian Pacific American Affairs ("Office"), which was created by legislation of the Maryland General Assembly in 1991. The duties and responsibilities of the Office include: organizing programs, events, and activities intended to promote the civic, social and economic development of Asian Pacific Americans; representing the Governor in any matter related to the community; and assisting and advising executive agencies on programs that aid Asian owned or operated businesses.

The Commission is charged with the following duties and responsibilities:

1. Serve in an advisory capacity to the Governor and to the Governor's Office on Asian Pacific American Affairs on issues relating to the social and economic development, and the rights and interests of Asian Pacific Americans in the State;
2. Provide assistance to the Office in identifying needs or problems affecting Asian Pacific Americans, and in developing appropriate responses and programs;
3. Assist the Office in maintaining effective liaison and outreach with Asian Pacific American groups and communities in the State, and in communicating information to them concerning public and private programs that are beneficial to their interests;
4. Promote the coordination of and, to the degree feasible, participate in the evaluation of programs and services provided by public and private sector agencies that affect the Asian Pacific American population of Maryland;
5. Coordinate with the Department of Human Resources and the Office of the Governor in reviewing and commenting on federal, state, or local legislative proposals that affect the Asian Pacific American population of Maryland;
6. Coordinate with the Department of Human Resources in making appropriate recommendations on matters affecting the health, safety and welfare of the Asian Pacific American population of Maryland; and
7. Perform any other duties that may be requested by the Governor.

The Commission meets six times a year, on the third Tuesday of odd-numbered months. Meeting sites alternate around the State.

On a daily basis, the major functions of the Office include: collaborating and exchanging information with community based organizations; maintaining relations with other government agencies; promoting a positive and fair image of Asian Pacific Americans; advocating and protecting individual rights of Asian Pacific Americans; and providing information to the community at large.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In 2006, the Governor's Office and Commission on Asian Pacific American Affairs strove to offer increasingly relevant initiatives on a wide variety of issues important to the Asian Pacific American community in Maryland, including business and economic development, international affairs, healthcare and education. The Commission was successful in this endeavor thanks in large part to the strategic partnerships developed with government agencies, community organizations, and private entities.

Change of Leadership

The Office and Commission welcomed a new Executive Director, David K. Lee, who continued the extensive community outreach efforts of his predecessors and brought with him a dedication to collaboration and partnership. Under his leadership, the Office and Commission helped organize a number of conferences and other initiatives to bring important information to the Asian Pacific American community. To this end, strategic partnerships were developed with key state agencies – such as the Department of Aging, Department of Business and Economic Development, Department of Housing and Community Development, Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, Governor's Office of Minority Affairs, and the Office of the Secretary of State – as well as federal and local government agencies and community organizations.

Historic Legislation

The Office and Commission joined a coalition of Asian Pacific American organizations to support passage of House Bill 324 and Senate Bill 89 to commemorate the Asian Lunar New Year Day in Maryland each year. This historic legislation passed both chambers of the General Assembly by an overwhelming margin, and was signed into law on May 2, 2006. One of only a handful of such

commemorative days recognized by Maryland, the annual observance of Asian Lunar New Year Day will help raise awareness of the significant contributions and diverse cultural heritage of Asian Pacific Americans in Maryland.

Asian American Business Conference

The Office and Commission was influential in the planning of the Asian American Business Conference in Rockville, Maryland. Commissioner Warren Minami served as chair of the planning committee, and former Commission Chair Benjamin Wu headed the program subcommittee for the Conference. The Commission worked with Rockville Economic Development, Inc. and a number of Asian American business leaders to put on a successful conference on doing business in the 21st century global economy.

International Affairs

Working with the Office of the Secretary of State's International Affairs Division, the Office and Commission played an active role in Maryland's Sister States Program. The Executive Director helped revive a dormant Sister State relationship with Gyeongsangnam Province in South Korea, and was involved in planning the first International Film Festival hosted by the Sister States Program.

Reaching Diverse Communities

In conjunction with the Governor's Commission on Hispanic Affairs and the Maryland Commission for Women, the Office and Commission hosted two conferences to assist minority communities in Maryland. The "Dialogue for Progress" conferences brought together experts and leaders from diverse communities to address common issues. These events reinforced the notion that, while Maryland's population is becoming increasingly diverse, our differences are not as great as our similarities.

Medicare D Outreach

Another strategic partnership was developed with the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), in the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. In conjunction with CMS's Asian American/Pacific Islander Outreach Coordinator, Anne Avery, the Office and Commission visited a number of faith-based and community organizations serving Asian Pacific American seniors, conducting educational seminars regarding the Medicare D Prescription Drug Program. The Office and Commission recruited and helped train bilingual volunteers to assist limited English proficient seniors in assessing their prescription drug needs and to enroll them via the internet in the most cost-effective programs.

Conclusion

The Governor's Office and Commission on Asian Pacific American Affairs built upon a strong tradition of service, outreach and advocacy, and developed new and existing partnerships to bring initiatives of lasting importance to the Asian Pacific American community. The Office and Commission will continue to strive to collaborate with public and private entities to ensure equal access to government programs and services, healthcare, education, and business opportunities for all Marylanders.

KEY ACCOMPLISHMENTS

■ Asian Lunar New Year Bill – May 2006

Supported the passage of House Bill 324 and Senate Bill 89 in the Maryland General Assembly authorizing the annual commemoration of Asian Lunar New Year, which was passed by an overwhelming margin and signed into law on May 2, 2006.

■ Asian Pacific American Heritage Month – May 2006

Attended and spoke at 16 different Asian Pacific American Heritage Month events at federal, state and local agencies as well as community-organized events, including:

- Asian Pacific American Chamber of Commerce

■ **Meeting Between Governor and Korean Ambassador Lee Tae-Sik – June 14, 2006**



Arranged a meeting between Governor and the Korean Ambassador, with a press conference and public reception afterward in the Governor's Reception Room, attended by over 150 Korean American community leaders and press.

■ **Asian American Business Conference – July 19, 2006**



In partnership with Rockville Economic Development, Inc. and community business leaders, helped plan and organize the Asian American Business Conference in Montgomery County, attended by over 200 people from the Asian American business community.

■ **Dialogue for Progress Conference – August 12, 2006 and October 28, 2006**

In conjunction with the Governor's Commission on Hispanic Affairs and the Maryland Commission for Women, the Office and Commission hosted a series of conferences for minorities on a wide array of topics, including:

- Business development
- Small business financing and licensing
- Public safety
- Health disparities
- Elder care
- Education
- Housing
- Grants



■ **Korean Sister States Committee – August to December, 2006**

Partnered with the Office of the Secretary of State to host a delegation of officials from Gyeongsangnam Province, South Korea, and to revive a dormant Sister State relationship with the province. Helped plan the first International Film Festival to benefit the Maryland Sister States Program.

■ **Medicare D Outreach** – October to December, 2006

In partnership with the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services at the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, the Maryland Department of Aging and local Area Agencies on Aging, the Office and Commission visited several senior centers as well as faith-based and community organizations, including:

- Brooklyn Park Senior Center (Anne Arundel County)
- Chinese Culture and Community Service Center (Montgomery County)
- Korean Presbyterian Church of Baltimore (Baltimore County)
- Korean American Senior Association of Howard County (Howard County)
- Holy Korean Martyr Catholic Church (Baltimore County)
- Vietnamese Senior Association of Maryland (Montgomery County)

At each location, Asian Pacific American seniors with limited English proficiency received a presentation in their native language regarding the Medicare D Prescription Drug Program. The Office and Commission also recruited and helped train bilingual volunteers, who followed up several weeks after the presentations to provide on-location counseling and internet enrollment for the seniors.

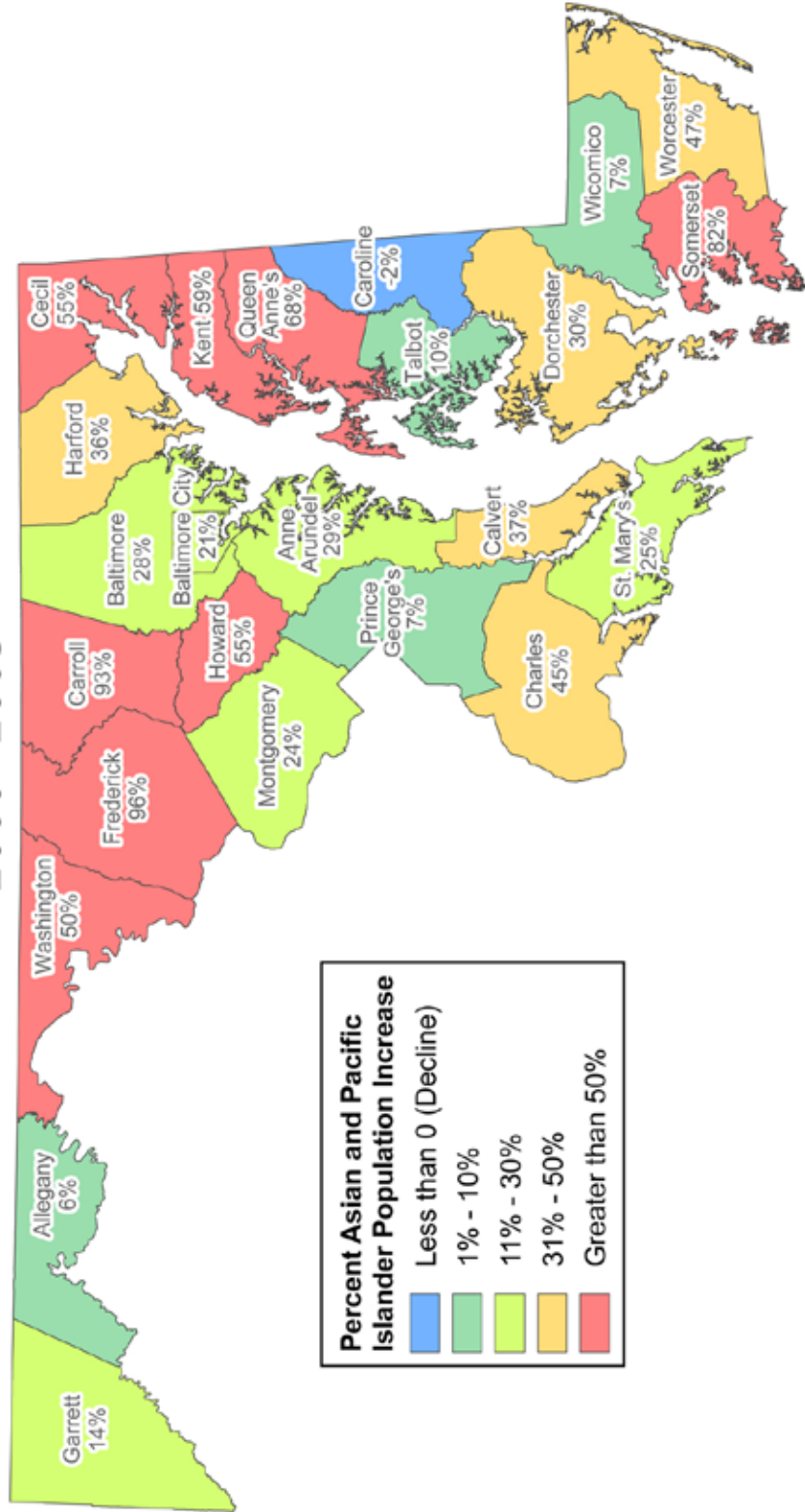

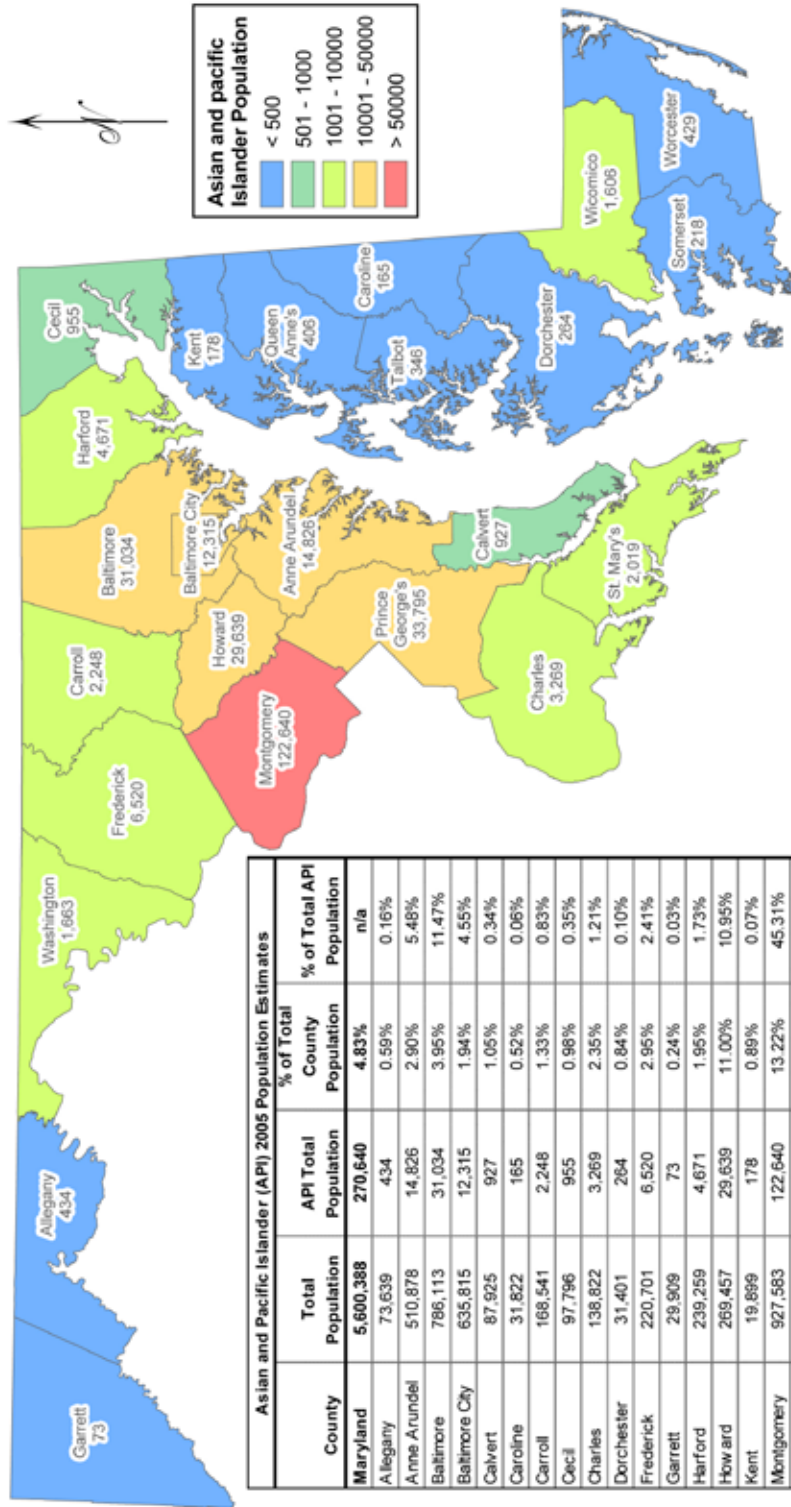
