Dear Chair Kelley and Chair McIntosh:

Section 5-304(b) (3) of the Human Services Article requires the Secretary of Budget and Management, with the assistance of the Secretary of Human Services (DHS) to report annually to the Senate Finance Committee and the House Appropriations Committee on the number of recipients of benefits through the Family Investment Program (FIP), children of current or former FIP recipients, foster youth, and child support obligors hired and retained by the principal departments within the Executive Branch of State government.

The attached chart, prepared by the Office of Personnel Services and Benefits, presents the data as reported by DHS. The chart includes the number of recipients hired by principal departments within the executive branch, and the number of recipients that were still employed as of June 30, 2021. There were 109 additional recipients hired in fiscal year 2021 as compared to fiscal year 2020. In fiscal year 2021, a total of four children of former recipients and two foster care youth were hired by executive branch principle departments. There were no children of current recipients or obligors hired and retained. The overall retention rate for this program since its inception in 1999 is 27 percent.
