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#### Introduction

This report summarizes the financial status of the Community Legacy Program as of June 30, 2010, including the following information required by the Housing and Community Development Article Section 6-210(b):

- The amount and type of financial assistance encumbered and disbursed;
- The number of applications received;
- The number and location of Community Legacy areas designated; and
- The summary of quarterly reports submitted by each sponsor.

Additionally, this report includes the following information required by the 2010 Joint Chairmen's Report (Page 229) for all Community Legacy projects with some or all funds unexpended:

- The dollar amount of all outstanding awards and unexpended funds by project;
- Identification of grant recipients and approved project scope for every grant award and approved scope modification; and
- Actions taken by the Community Legacy Board to re-evaluate projects for which the scope had changed.

#### **Background**

The Community Legacy Program, created in 2001, assists urban neighborhoods, suburban communities, and small towns that are experiencing decline and disinvestment, but which have the potential, with modest public and private investment, to once again become vibrant places for Marylanders to live, work and prosper. Indications of decline include dropping property values, population loss, decreasing income and education levels, and increasing housing and commercial vacancies. Indications of community strength include proximity to town centers, major employers, educational or other institutions; partnerships with local banks, other businesses, and community organizations; and, community leadership.

In order to be eligible for funding, communities must develop a multi-year comprehensive revitalization strategy that is an ambitious, but achievable, response to local needs. By offering funding for diverse initiatives over time, Community Legacy helps build the momentum necessary to reverse community decline and attract private sector reinvestment.

#### **Administration**

The Community Legacy Program is administered by the Department of Housing and Community Development's (DHCD) Division of Neighborhood Revitalization (NR), with assistance from other divisions in DHCD. One competitive funding round is held annually. After applications are reviewed by NR for conformity with basic criteria, the qualified applications are assigned to review teams comprised of staff from DHCD and other State agencies to conduct site visits and develop funding recommendations.

Historically, the Community Legacy Board, chaired by the DHCD Secretary and including the Secretaries of the Departments of Planning, Transportation, and Natural Resources has been, by statute, the entity that makes the final funding determination. On December 22, 2009 the Community Legacy Board approved the recommended Community Legacy projects for FY 2010.

#### **Sustainable Communities Act of 2010 (House Bill 475)**

The 2010 Sustainable Communities Act (House Bill 475) contained a number of changes to the Community Legacy Program, including terminating the Community Legacy Board effective June 1, 2010. This affects Community Legacy Program approval processes as follows:

- DHCD will receive applications and consider any recommendations from a State unit or a member of the Smart Growth Sub-Cabinet.
- The DHCD Secretary now has the authority to award financial assistance in the amount and type determined under the terms of the Community Legacy Program.
- The DHCD Secretary may consent to modifications to any awards.

In addition, effective June 1, 2010, all Community Legacy Areas and Designated Neighborhoods received interim re-designation as Sustainable Communities. This new, consolidated designation will be easier for program users to understand and will simplify program administration for both State and local governments.

The interim Sustainable Communities designation will continue for a transition period, during which time local governments will have the opportunity to apply for continued designation. The term of the transition period is as follows:

- Existing Community Legacy Areas designated prior to January 1, 2008 will become Sustainable Communities for 24 months after June 1, 2010.
- Existing Community Legacy Areas designated on or after January 1, 2008 will be considered Sustainable Communities for a period of 36 months after June 1, 2010.

An application procedure is being developed for local governments to request continued Sustainable Communities designation beyond the transition period. It is anticipated that DHCD will begin accepting applications for Sustainable Communities in the winter of 2011.

Applications for Sustainable Communities designation will be reviewed by an interagency panel led by the Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development and must be approved by the Governor's Smart Growth Subcabinet. Newly approved Sustainable Communities (those that apply after June 1, 2010) will retain their designation for a period of five years.

Sustainable Communities will also include designated Transit Oriented Development Zones (TOD) and Base Realignment and Closure Zones (BRAC). These areas automatically became Sustainable Communities effective June 1, 2010 and do not need to reapply for continued designation.

#### Distribution and Allocation of Community Legacy Areas and Awards

Starting with an initial fifty-two designated Community Legacy Areas in 2002, the Community Legacy Board has designated one hundred and three Community Legacy Areas including the Town of Westernport (Allegany County), Town of Chestertown (Kent County) and the Town of Forest Heights (Prince George's County) which were added in FY 2010. The following maps show Community Legacy Awards by County, the first map for FY 2010, the second for the period of FY 2002 through FY 2010.

In the Fiscal Year 2010 budget, the Community Legacy Program was authorized to expend \$2.1 million in capital funds, with no authorization for operating awards. Attachments 1 and 2 provide a complete list of applications, including both funded and non funded projects.

In FY 2010, DHCD received 66 applications seeking \$21.7 million for 137 projects to support a broad range of activities aimed at boosting investments in targeted areas. The demand for the Community Legacy Program was more than ten times the funds available for award.

Applicants included municipal and county governments, community development organizations, and Community Development Financial Institutions (CDFI). Only 17 of the 137 individual project requests were able to be awarded due to limited funds.

#### **Disbursement Status of Community Legacy Awards**

The Community Legacy Program is intended to fill gaps in other public and private funding sources. As a result, Community Legacy funds are normally not the only funding source or the primary funding source. By design, Community Legacy agreements allow for the on-going nature of revitalization projects as well as the gap-financing role of Community Legacy. An overview of the disbursement status of all prior Community Legacy rounds follows.

As illustrated in the above chart, 94% of the CL funds awarded from FY 2002 through FY 2009 have been fully disbursed. Agreements for FY 2010 were executed towards the end of the fiscal year and as a result, the disbursements were in the very early stages (approximately 1% of awards) as of June 30. Project detail is included in Attachments 3 through 11.

**NOTE:** All disbursements are calculated as of June 30, 2010. The Community Legacy disbursements are processed by the Community Legacy Project Managers once a request for payment with back-up documentation has been received from the awardee. Depending on the type of project, the awardee may have several draw requests for a given project.

#### **Summary of Quarterly Reports**


Quarterly reports are submitted by Community Legacy recipients beginning with the end of the first quarter after the Community Legacy agreement is fully executed. Attachment 12 details the summaries and the project status for each of the 186 Community Legacy Awards with an unexpended balance during FY 2010. Of these projects, 15 (8%) received an approved modification to change the scope, repayment terms or the project timeline.

#### Summary of Modifications Approved by the Community Legacy Board

As seen in Attachment 13, 12 Community Legacy projects have gone back to the Community Legacy Board for a modification. This represents only 3% of the 543 projects approved over the life of the Community Legacy Program. No additional modifications will be presented to the Community Legacy Board for approval, since the Board was terminated on June 1, 2010 as described above.

# Community Legacy (CL) Awards by County FY 2010


