ANNUAL REPORT – 2011

This report covers the activities of the Maryland Board of Professional Counselors and Therapists for the period ending December 31, 2011.

The Maryland Board of Professional Counselors and Therapists functions under Health Occupations Article, Title 17, Annotated Code of Maryland. The State Board of Professional Counselors and Therapists (the "Board") is the licensure and certification authority of professional counselors; marriage and family therapists, and alcohol and drug counselors in the State of Maryland. The Board is mandated to regulate the practice of professional counseling and therapy in Maryland by licensing and certifying qualified counselors and therapists, promulgating regulations for the practice of professional counseling, marriage and family therapy, and alcohol and drug counseling, verifying credentials, issuing licenses and certificates, establishing requirements for and verifying completion of continuing education hours, investigating complaints based on alleged violations of regulations and statutes, formal and informal disciplining of licensees and certificate holders, establishing committees as deemed appropriate to advise the Board, and submit an annual report to the Governor and Secretary (H.O. Ann. Code of Md, §17-205 (b) (2)).

Mission

The Mission of the Board of Professional Counselors and Therapists is to protect the citizens of Maryland and to promote high quality health care in the field of professional counseling, marriage and family therapy, and alcohol and drug counseling.

Meetings

During the year, the Board held 10 formal meetings and monthly committee meetings.

Board Members

The Board consists of 13 members: five licensed clinical professional counselors, three licensed clinical marriage and family therapists, three licensed clinical alcohol and drug counselors and two consumer members.

Finances

The Board of Professional Counselors and Therapists is special funded. Revenues, which support the Board's operations, are generated through licensing and certification fees. No other State funds can be used to support the Board's operations.

The Board's 2011 fund balance was \$302,272. In fiscal year 2011 the Board generated \$713,111 in revenues. The Board's expenditures totaled \$617,486.

Complaints

HB311/SB476 – Professional Counselors and Therapists – Continuing Education – Home Study – *Passed (Chapter Numbers 481 and 480)*


Repealing a provision prohibiting the State Board of Professional Counselors and Therapists from authorizing home study courses towards completion of continuing education requirements.




