Dear Chairman Middleton:

The Department of Human Resources (DHR) is submitting an annual local government hiring plan report in accordance with the provisions of Human Services Article § 5-304(c)(4).

The Department of Human Resources, local departments of social services and local governments maintain hiring plans under which the local governmental unit may hire DHR's targeted population. The targeted population is comprised of current and former Temporary Cash Assistance (TCA) recipients, the children of current and former TCA recipients, foster youth and child support obligors. Each hiring plan includes a "first source" requirement that provides the targeted population first consideration for job openings, job interviews and hiring decisions.

In collaboration with the Maryland Association of Counties, over the past year a total of 1,602 targeted individuals were employed under local government hiring plans. The job placements were part of a comprehensive strategy that included intensive training and internship programs provided to the targeted individuals. For example, partners such as the Mayor's Office of Employment and Development in Baltimore and the non-profit organization Humanim, Inc. provided participants with job seeking services that included résumé writing development and interviewing techniques. A majority of the hiring activity, 58 percent, occurred in three jurisdictions – Baltimore City (388), Baltimore County (307) and Prince George's County (215). A total of 71.5 percent of the 1,602 job placements retained employment in the subsequent quarter.

Table 1 of this report provides the number of job placements by target group. The overwhelming majority of current and former TCA recipients, 78.1 percent and 81.3 percent, respectively, retained their jobs in the subsequent quarter. Table 2 of this report provides quarterly recorded job placements and retention data for all target groups. Table 3 of this report provides a detailed listing of each local agency or administration that entered into a local hiring plan and the total number of targeted individuals hired under each hiring plan.

The Department will continue to work collaboratively with the local departments of social services to continue the success of the Job Skills Enhancement Program.
