Dear Chairman Middleton and Madam Chair McIntosh:

The Department of Human Resources (DHR) is submitting an annual local government hiring plan report in accordance with the provisions of Human Services Articles § 5-304(c)(4).

DHR, the local departments of social services (LDSS) and local governments maintain a hiring plan under which local governments may hire DHR's targeted populations. The targeted populations are current and former Temporary Cash Assistance (TCA) recipients, the children of current and former TCA recipients, foster youth and child support obligors. Each hiring plan includes a "first source" requirement that provides the targeted populations first consideration for job openings, job interviews and hiring decisions.

In collaboration with the Maryland Association of Counties, a total of 1,960 participants were placed into jobs. The placements were in various sectors, including customer service and clerical support. The job placements for SFY 2016 were part of a comprehensive strategy that included intense trainings and internship programs provided to the participants. For example, partner agencies such as the Baltimore City Mayor's Office of Employment and Development, Arbor E & T, and Humanim Inc. provided participants with services that allowed our customers to obtain the required skills such as résumé writing and interviewing techniques. A large concentration of hires were made in the three largest jurisdictions - Baltimore City (683), Baltimore County (167), and Prince George's County (66). From the 1,960 participants that were placed, 69.6 percent retained employment in the subsequent quarter. Since SFY 2015, there has been an increase in total placements from 1,665 to 1,960 which is an 18 percent increase for SFY 2016. Tables 1 and 2 of this report provide the number of job placements by target group for SFY 2016 and SFY 2015, respectively. In SFY 2016, the overwhelming

majority of current (74.4 percent) and former (78.3 percent) TCA recipients retained their jobs in the subsequent quarter. Tables 3 and 4 of this report provide first quarter results of job placements and retention data for all target groups, for SFY 2016 and SFY 2015, respectively.

The Department will continue to work collaboratively with the LDSS to continue the success of Hiring Agreements participants. Thank you for your commitment to providing and improving opportunities for our most vulnerable Marylanders.
