

From the period of April 1, 2011 to June 30, 2011:

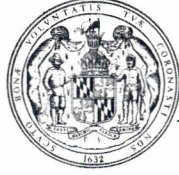
There were no combat related deaths or injuries of Maryland National Guard members serving on active duty.
