From the period of July 1, 2015 to September 30, 2015:

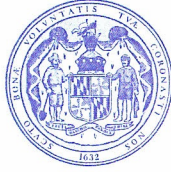
There were no related deaths or injuries of Maryland National Guard members serving globally on active duty.
