INTRODUCTION

Pursuant to Maryland Code, State Finance and Procurement §15-111, the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services (Department) is required to submit an annual report on Sole Source, Expedited, and Emergency Procurements and Service Contracts Exceeding \$100,000, to the Chief Procurement Officer.

Maryland Code, State Finance and Procurement §15-111

(a) Within 60 days after the end of each fiscal year, each primary procurement unit shall submit to the Chief Procurement Officer a report on each procurement contract that was awarded during the preceding fiscal year, whether the procurement was conducted by the primary procurement unit or subject to review by the primary procurement unit, and:

- (1) was exempt from the notice requirements of § 13-103(c) of this article because the procurement officer reasonably expected that the procurement contract would be performed entirely outside this State and the District of Columbia;*
- (2) cost more than \$100,000 and was awarded for the procurement of services, construction related services, architectural services, or engineering services; or*
- (3) was awarded on the basis of:*
 - (i) § 13-107 of this article (“Sole source procurement”);*
 - (ii) § 13-108(a) of this article (“Emergency procurement”); or*
 - (iii) § 13-108(c) of this article (“Expedited procurement”).*

(b) (1) A report required under subsection (a)(2) or (3) of this section shall include:

- (iv) The name of each contractor;*
- (v) The type and cost of the procurement contract;*
- (vi) A description of the procurement.*

(2) A report required under subsection (a)(3) of this section shall include:

- (vii) A description of the basis for the award;*
- (viii) The identity of the department or agency that awarded the contract;*
- (ix) The identify of any agency official required to authorize the contract for award;*
- (x) The award date of the procurement contract and the final date of the contract term;*
- (xi) The date the contract award was posted to eMaryland Marketplace*
- (xii) For procurements awarded under 13-108(b) of this article (“Emergency Procurement”):*
 - 1. The number of days between the agency declaration of an emergency procurement and the contract award date;*
 - 2. The date of the emergency declaration for each procurement; and*
 - 3. For an award that must be reported to the Board, the date the award was reported to the Board.*

OVERVIEW

The mission of the Office of Procurement Services, a centralized procurement unit within the Department, is to facilitate the procurement of goods and services necessary for the effective and efficient operation of the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services. It is the Office’s responsibility to maintain and ensure compliance with State Code of Maryland regulations and internal control procedures, to conduct business with the highest level of support, ethical standards, competitiveness, fairness and transparency.

The Office of Procurement Services consists of four separate procurement units to process all requests via various procurement methods including sole source, emergency, and services for the various operations of the Department. The four procurement units consist of Commodities, Maintenance, Information and Technology, and Services, and are further defined below:

- **Commodities Unit** manages goods purchased through a contract, such as food, equipment, or fixed assets. Commodity contracts can also include certain types of leases.

- **Maintenance Unit** manages contracts that provide a good or service to maintain facility buildings and grounds in proper condition. These goods or services can include construction, preventative maintenance, and corrective maintenance projects.
- **Information Technology Unit** manages contracts that provide software, hardware, and licensing services.
- **Service Unit** manages contracts that define the terms and conditions of a service being provided by a vendor.

This report summarizes contracts procured that exceed \$100,000 and was awarded for the procurement of services, construction-related services, architectural services, or engineering services, and also summarizes contracts awarded through a sole source or emergency procurement. Per the Code of Maryland Regulations, the Department is not authorized to conduct “expedited procurements”.

ANNUAL REPORT

CONCLUSION

In Fiscal Year 2022, the Department awarded:

- 6 contracts exceeding \$100,000 procured for a total amount of \$232,372,077.81
- 21 sole-source contracts in the total amount of \$8,300,841.78

- 9 emergency procurements in the total amount of \$2,769,925.19

The Office of Procurement Services will continue to procure goods and services for the Department in compliance with the Code of Maryland, Office of State Procurement, and Board of Public Works regulations and advisories. However, during a period of management transition and staff turnover, the Office of Procurement Services failed to post award notices to eMMA within the required 30-day timeline, and also failed to report the emergency contract with Ellsworth Electronic, Inc. within a timely fashion to the Board of Public Works. To prevent further non-compliance, the Department created a Quality Assurance and Quality Control (QAQC) division that will ensure proper compliance of all procurement regulations by reviewing and assessing current policies and practices to improve identified deficiencies.
