Parole and Probation Agent Reemployment of Retirees

Introduction

The Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services was given authorization to rehire retired parole and probation employees. The following is the language requirement from State Personnel and Pensions, Article 22-406.

On or before September 1 of each year, the Secretary of Public Safety and Correctional Services shall submit a report in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article to the Joint Committee on Pensions that provides:

- (1) the number of rehired retirees under subsection (c)(4)(x) of this section;
- (2) the annual salary of each rehired retiree at the time of retirement and the current annual salary of each rehired retiree;
- (3) the number of parole and probation employees hired who are not retirees; and
- (4) the annual salary of each Parole and Probation employee who is hired.

Status of Rehired, Retired Parole & Probation Agents

- 1) There were no parole and probation agents rehired in FY 14.
