Introduction

The Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services was given authorization to rehire retired parole and probation employees, State Personnel and Pensions §22-406. The following is the language requirement of § 22-406.

On or before September 1 of each year, the Secretary of Public Safety and Correctional Services shall submit a report in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article to the Joint Committee on Pensions that provides:

(1) the number of rehired retirees under subsection (c)(4)(x) of this section;

(2) the annual salary of each rehired retiree at the time of retirement and the current annual salary of each rehired retiree;

(3) the number of parole and probation employees hired who are not retirees; and(4) the annual salary of each Parole and Probation employee who is hired.

Status of Rehired, Retired Parole & Probation Agents

- 1) There were no parole and probation agents rehired in FY'16.
- 2) No retiree was rehired.
- 3) The number of parole and probation agents hired who were not retirees: FY'16 62 hired
- 4) The average annual salary of the parole and probation agents hired: FY' 16 \$40,698
