Introduction

Chapters 359 and 360 of 2008, *Criminal Procedure - Custodial Interrogation - Recordation*, established a State policy in which a law enforcement unit using one or more interrogation rooms with the capability to create audio and/or visual recordings of custodial interrogations shall make reasonable efforts to record interrogations of suspects in connection with cases of murder, rape, or sexual offenses in the first or second degree. It also requires the Governor's Office of Crime Prevention, Youth, and Victim Services (Office) - previously known as the Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention² - to submit a report to the House Judiciary Committee and the Senate Judicial Proceedings Committee by December 31, 2009, and annually thereafter, as it relates to the progress of jurisdictions and the Department of State Police in establishing interrogation rooms capable of creating audiovisual recordings of custodial interrogations. To assist in this process, the Office makes funding available to local law enforcement agencies through the Byrne Justice Assistance Grant, Law Enforcement Technology grant program for "custodial interrogation equipment." Additional funds have also been made available through the Byrne Justice Recovery Act since the law was enacted in 2008.

Interrogation Rooms

In accordance with § 2-404 of the Criminal Procedure Article, this *Progress of Jurisdictions and the Department of State Police in Establishing Interrogations Rooms Capable of Creating Audiovisual Recordings of Custodial Interrogations 2020 Report* summarizes and evaluates data reported by law enforcement agencies in the State for the prior year (January 1, 2020 - December 31, 2020).

Methodology

For the purpose of this report, the Office distributed an electronic interrogation room survey to all law enforcement agencies in the State to gather information on the following:

- 1. The agency name
- 2. The number of interrogation rooms
- 3. The hardwired technological capabilities of each room (none, audio, visual, or both audio and visual)



- 4. The portable technological equipment used in each room (none, audio, visual, or both audio and visual)
- 5. Did the agency have future plans for adding interrogation rooms
- 6. Did the agency have future plans for purchasing new audio/visual equipment for each room
- 7. The funding source for each room

Findings

Number of Interrogation Rooms


The Office received surveys from 131 law enforcement agencies of which 91 (69.5%) reported at least one interrogation room (as shown in Chart 1). The remaining 40 (30.5%) reported that they have no interrogation room. In total, there are 331 interrogation rooms across the state. The survey also found the Prince George's County Police Department to have the highest number of interrogation rooms in the State, with a total of 50 rooms (as illustrated in the Appendix). Of the 91 agencies that have at least one interrogation room, six (Anne Arundel County Police Department, Baltimore Police Department, Maryland State Police, Montgomery County Police Department, and Prince George's County Police Department) accounted for nearly half of all interrogation rooms in the State (165 rooms).




Audio/Visual Recording Capabilities

Of the 331 interrogation rooms in the State, 263 (79.4%) are equipped with some type of hardwired audio or visual recording capabilities. This represents a slight increase over the

number of rooms reported in 2019 that were equipped with some type of audio or visual recording capability (n = 239). Of the rooms equipped with technologies in 2020, the vast majority (72.5%) have both audio and visual recording capabilities. As illustrated below, **Chart 2. Interrogation Room's Hardwired Recording Capabilities** provides the various types of hardwired recording capabilities utilized within interrogation rooms in Maryland. Of the 91 agencies with at least one interrogation room, 22% (n = 20) use some type of portable audio or visual recording device (as shown in **Chart 3**).






Future Plans for Interrogation Rooms or Audio/Visual Recording Enhancements

Most of the agencies indicated no future plans for the creation or addition of interrogation rooms within their agency (90%).³ Furthermore, 68.7% of agencies reported no future plans of purchasing new audio or visual recording equipment.⁴

Funding Sources

Ninety-nine agencies listed a current or future funding source(s) for their interrogation rooms. As illustrated below, **Chart 4. Police Agency Funding Source for Current or Future**Interrogation Rooms provides a breakdown of the various local, State, and/or federal funding sources.



Conclusion

The major findings of the electronic interrogation room survey to law enforcement agencies include the following:

- Over two-thirds of Maryland law enforcement agencies have at least one interrogation room to conduct custodial interrogations.
- Nearly three-fourths of interrogation rooms are equipped with some type of hardwired audio or visual recording capabilities, many times both recording options are available.

- Sixty-three percent of all audio visual recording equipment in law enforcement interrogation rooms are stationary and cannot be transported.
- Most agencies have not indicated any future plans to add new or additional interrogation rooms or new forms of audio/visual recording equipment.

The Office will continue to provide support through the Byrne Justice Assistance Grant, Law Enforcement Technology grant program for "custodial interrogation equipment," and will provide annual updates on the progress of each law enforcement agency in establishing interrogation rooms capable of creating audio/visual recordings of custodial interrogations.
