In accordance with Section 6-201.2(a) of the Transportation Article, I am submitting this report as Chairman of the Maryland Port Commission on actions taken under this subsection during fiscal year 2020. Under Section 6-201.2(a), the Maryland Port Commission is authorized to appoint up to a total of twelve management personnel employees to operate and manage all State-owned port facilities or to perform services for private operating companies created under Section 6-204(q) of the Transportation Article. The Commission was also granted the authority to determine the qualifications, appointments, and compensation for these employees. As to the reporting requirement, Section 6-201.2(a)(8) of the Transportation Article directs that:

"On or before December 1 of each year, the Commission shall report to the Governor and the Legislative Policy Committee of the General Assembly on actions taken by the Commission under this subsection during the previous fiscal year with regard to individuals subject to this subsection."

During fiscal year 2020, the Port Commission took the following actions with regard to the management personnel employees:

- MPC Executive Director (James J. White) retired effective December 31, 2019. The position was not filled until FY 2021.
- As Maryland State employees, all of the management personnel positions received the general increases of 3% on July 1, 2019 and 1% on January 1, 2020, as approved by the General Assembly.
