Dear President Miller and Speaker Busch:

This letter is written in response to language set forth in Senate Bill 413, Chapter 578, Acts 2008, titled *Courts—Service of Process—Motor Vehicle Administration (MVA) as Agent for Nonresident Driver*. The language directs:

*"That the Motor Vehicle Administration shall report to the General Assembly on or before January 1 of each year, in accordance with §2-1246 of the State Government Article, the following information for the preceding calendar year:*

- 1. The total number of subpoenas, summonses, and other service of process issued in accordance with the provisions of this section;*
- 2. The number of instances in which the Motor Vehicle Administration failed to reach the individual being served and the reasons that those attempts failed;*
- 3. A breakdown of all direct and indirect costs incurred by the Motor Vehicle Administration in carrying out the requirements of this section; and*
- 4. The total fees collected by the Motor Vehicle Administration from persons requesting service of process under this section."*

The legislation designates the Motor Vehicle Administration (MVA) as the agent for a nonresident driver with regard to service of process related to a crash involving a motor vehicle driven by the nonresident. The bill allows the MVA to establish and collect a fee to recover the Administration's costs. The provisions apply prospectively to cases filed on or before October 1, 2008. As of October 27, 2009, the MVA has collected \$549.00 stemming from this requirement. MVA anticipates a progressive increase in the volume of subpoenas issued and revenue collected from FY 2010 through FY 2013.

- Total Fees Collected (9 x \$61)..... \$549.00
