

Federal Immigration Enforcement Requests for Data

This annual report was prepared in response to language contained in House Bill (HB) 23, (Chapter 18, Acts of 2021). Specifically, the language directs:

“On or before June 1, 2023, and each June 1 thereafter, the Motor Vehicle Administration, the Department of State Police, and the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services shall, with respect to requests from federal agencies seeking access for the purpose of federal immigration enforcement for personal information, a photograph of an individual, or a facial recognition search, whether or not the request was initiated through a State or local law enforcement agency, report to the General Assembly, in accordance with § 2-1257 of the State Government Article, the following information for the immediately preceding calendar year”

This Act directed that the Maryland Department of Transportation Motor Vehicle Administration (MVA) to report the number of requests received from any federal agency for personal information, a photograph of an individual, or a facial recognition search.

It further requires the MVA to report the number of requests received from any federal agency for personal information, a photograph of an individual, or a facial recognition search for which a valid warrant was issued by “a federal court of [sic] court of this State” was provided.

Additionally, the MVA must report the number and purpose of facial recognition searches completed for any federal agency based on personal information or a photograph of an individual provided to the federal agency by the MVA.

Finally, the number of individuals whose personal information or photograph was provided to any federal agency by the MVA is required in this report as well.

As noted in written testimony submitted on the matter during bill hearings, law enforcement access to MVA records occurs via the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services (DPSCS), through either the Local Law Enforcement Dashboard (Dashboard) or the Maryland Electronic Telecommunications Enforcement Dashboard (METERS). Law enforcement access to these databases is certified by the Maryland State Police for state and local agencies, and by the Federal Bureau of Investigations for federal agencies.

As a result of this, in 2025 the MVA was unable to provide the count for any such requests originating via DPSCS, Dashboard, or METERS. However, any such requests made directly to the MVA are tracked each year as required by HB 23, CH 18. Those requests were as follows:

There were two (2) requests that met the criteria laid out in Maryland General Article § 4-320 and/or 4-320.1 during Calendar Year 2025. No information was provided by the MVA to the requesting agencies.
