## Chapter 707 of the Acts of 2017

2021 Report to Maryland Governor Larry Hogan and the Maryland General Assembly From: George Owings, Secretary, Maryland Department of Veterans Affairs Status of the Veterans' Services Specialists in State Government (SB857/HB1275)

Introduced during the 2017 Maryland Legislative Session and signed into law by Governor Hogan on May 25, 2017, SB857/HB1275 created Veterans' Services Specialists in State Government to coordinate services with the Outreach and Advocacy Program Director in the Department of Veterans Affairs.

Specialists attend training, provide the Department of Veterans Affairs with certain information and post information on their respective Department or Agency websites. Information required for posting on websites includes veteran services offered by the respective Department or Agency and a link to the Department of Veterans Affairs Outreach and Advocacy Program. The MDVA continues to work with Departments and Agencies to have this information placed on websites.

The Act also requires the Department of Veterans Affairs to coordinate meetings and an annual training, and submit a progress report each January to the Governor and Maryland General Assembly. The Act took effect October 1, 2017.

Meetings were held virtually in February, April, June, and August. Annual training was held virtually in November alongside local county veteran commission leaders. Briefings were shared on the MDVA YouTube Channel.
