The academic programs presented in this report are listed by institution in the chronological order of their approval or endorsement by the Maryland Higher Education Commission.

I. PROGRAMS FAVORABLY REVIEWED AND APPROVED

Independent Colleges and Universities

College of Notre Dame of Maryland

Bachelor of Arts in Digital Media Arts (Endorsed 03-21-06) The program will prepare students for entry-level positions in technical and related occupations, one of the five top job openings that will occur as the result of economic growth over the next five years.

Bachelor of Arts in Information and Communication Management (Endorsed 03-21-06) The program is designed for students interested in the retrieval and interpretation of data and the strategic importance of communication within today's contemporary organizations. The degree is also designed to prepare students to meet the challenges of the manager's role, regardless of the size of the organization. The program emphasizes the importance of strong communication systems and information management with an emphasis on managerial roles and responsibilities in strategic management within organizations.

Columbia Union College

Upper-Division Certificate in Alcohol and Drug Counseling Certification (Endorsed 07-26-06)

The program is designed to assist students in meeting the course requirements for certification by the Maryland Board of Professional Counselors and Therapists (commonly known as the CPC Board) as a Certified Associate Counselor or Certified Supervised Counselor – Alcohol and Drug as per COMAR 10.58.07.

Johns Hopkins University

Post-Baccalaureate Certificate in International Studies (Endorsed 05-30-06) The program will provide a broad overview of international relations and allows for a concentration in a series of related courses for those students wishing to specialize. It also offers general training for those wishing to achieve a wider appreciation of international politics.

Post-Baccalaureate Certificate in International Development (Endorsed 05-30-06) The program will provide an interdisciplinary approach to the study of developing countries. Students will receive training through classroom experiences that helps them to better conceptualize development problems through social, political, economic and environmental aspects of development. *Post-Baccalaureate Certificate in Emerging Markets (Endorsed 05-30-06)* The program will provide an introduction to the financial markets of developing countries. It focuses on developing economies with relatively low per capita income, often with above-average economic growth potential that are becoming increasingly sophisticated and integrated into international markets. It covers risks, markets, restrictions and factors associated with emerging countries. Opportunities for regional study include but are not limited to Africa, Central Asia, China, Latin America, the Middle East, Russia, South and Southeast Asia, and more.

Master in Early Music Performance (Endorsed 06-28-06)

The program will provide students with one-on-one instruction as well as training in historical approaches. Upon completion of the program, the graduate will be ready to enter the professional world of early music as a chamber musician or highly qualified orchestral player.

Doctor of Philosophy in Astronomy and Astrophysics (Endorsed 06-27-06) The program will prepare Ph.D. graduates for careers in teaching and research in astronomy, astrophysics, or in applications such as space physics and industrial research.

Loyola College in Maryland

Bachelor of Arts in Writing (Endorsed 02-22-06)

The Writing major allows students to pursue a broad spectrum of writing courses that will deepen their expertise in the writing of essays, short stories, poetry, reviews, and many other fields.

Master of Arts in Teaching with concentrations in Elementary and Secondary Education (Endorsed 12-07-06)

The program is a high quality initial certification and advanced degree program, consistent with the mission of the College, which meets the needs of individuals wishing to prepare to enter the teaching profession and achieve an advanced degree in the process. The program will serve individuals currently teaching without certification and career changers. The program provides a curriculum that utilizes current theory and practice, exposes students to critical issues in education, and provides extensive field-based experiences.

Mount St. Mary's University

Bachelor of Science in Environmental Science (Endorsed 06-08-09) The program will provide students the opportunity to better understand the complex workings of nature, as well as to confront the difficult issues regarding resource use and our relationship to the environment.

Sojourner-Douglass College

Bachelor of Science in Biotechnology (Endorsed 05-30-06)

The program is designed to produce highly qualified scientists that can help meet the employment demands of the biotechnology industry by thinking critically, communicating effectively, analyzing data, and making informed decisions concerning the societal and ethnical implications of biotechnology.

Lower-Division Certificate in Licensed Practical Nursing (Endorsed 07-24-06) The program is designed to educate and train students in nursing, basic sciences, effective communication, critical thinking, and computer skill sets required for a successful career in the health care industry.

Bachelor of Arts and Upper-Division Certificate in Political Campaign Management (Endorsed 10-19-06)

The program is designed to produce political campaign personnel skilled in planning, marshalling resources for staffing, organizing and executing political campaigns. Further, the program is designed to produce leaders who have the ability to direct campaigns effectively, efficiently, and creatively.

Bachelor of Arts in Psychology/Counseling (Endorsed 11-21-06)

The psychology/counseling program is designed to give students the understanding that both are disciplines that contribute to the understanding of human behavior, mental processes and experiences. The program provides a strong foundation for advanced study leading to a master's or doctorate degree. It prepares the graduate to work in careers in the fields of psychology, counseling and guidance, or to study in the health professions, social work, and pupil personnel services. It provides the student with the ability to enhance the quality of their life and to relate more effectively with others.

Bachelor of Arts in Business Administration (Endorsed 11-21-06)

The Business Administration program crosses a varied section of the administrative sciences. The courses are intended to introduce students to principles of business administration, administering business ethics in public, private and governmental agencies, personnel management, financial management, and organizational theory and behavior. Business administrators focus on the health of the state's business and industry through, research, management, policy planning, developing, implementing, and collaborating with private and governmental agencies. Students completing the Business Administration degree program will be prepared to meet the challenges of intellectual and professional requirements; sophisticated information delivery systems; and managing public or private organizations.

Bachelor of Arts in Public Administration (Endorsed 11-21-06)

The Public Administration program encompasses a broad section of the administrative sciences. The program will prepare students for employment in the field of government and private administration and will prepare them to analyze and assess government activities, basic principles of organizations, decision-making, fiscal management, personnel management and other forms of action in government, organizations and the public sector.

Bachelor of Arts in Social Work (Endorsed 11-21-06)

The Social Work program is a synthesis of the theoretical and practical aspects of the field. The curriculum explores the history, purposes, and philosophy of social work and is grounded in a body of knowledge, values and skills necessary to the preparation of competent generalist social workers. The program will prepare students for beginning level practice in the profession in both the public and private sector and prepare students for advanced learning in social work.

Bachelor of Arts in Criminal Justice (Endorsed 11-21-06)

The Criminal Justice Program at Sojourner-Douglass College provides instruction in the theories and practices employed in the criminal justice field. Through class instruction and professional internship placements, the program will provide the student with knowledge of the professional, technical, social and ethical aspects of the criminal justice practice. The needs of the community and the profession will be met through highly qualified, self motivated and critically thinking graduates.

Bachelor of Arts in Addiction and Substance Abuse Counseling (Endorsed 11-21-06) The program is designed to prepare students both theoretically and clinically in addictions and substance abuse counseling. Students are challenged to think creatively and critically and to develop skills necessary to be effective addictions counselors. This program will identify counseling and motivations techniques that will lead to the successful service to those individuals suffering from alcohol and drug dependency in treatment. It will provide the essential courses leading to a well trained and certified professional. The program curriculum has been developed according to the Trandisciplinary Foundations for Addiction Professionals program model established in 1996 by the National Curriculum Committee of the Addiction Technology. In addition to a solid understanding of the foundations for service, counselors are trained in the "Eight Core Addiction Counselor Competencies," established by the national committee. Graduates of this program will be prepared for professions in counseling and related services to the addicted population.

Bachelor of Arts in Accounting (Endorsed 11-21-06)

The Accounting program encompasses a broad section of the administrative sciences. It consists of extensive specialized accounting courses as well as related business subjects and in general studies. The Accounting program is designed to prepare students for entry

level positions in public accounting firms and/or governmental and non-profit organizations. Positions typically include staff accountants in public accounting firms or in finance tax or cost departments. Students are prepared for graduate study and for professional certification. Students will also develop a proficiency in technology.

Bachelor of Arts in Gerontology (Endorsed 11-21-06)

Gerontology is the study of the aging process and the issues associated with aging in society. The program at Sojourner-Douglass is interdisciplinary and designed to increase knowledge regarding the aging process; improve the quality of life for the aged. It prepares graduates for employment in the field of aging and to work with governmental agencies and private agencies in varied positions.

Bachelor of Arts in Health Care Administration (Endorsed 11-21-06)

This program is designed to provide students with a solid theoretical and practical background to effectively manage human, information, and physical resources in a health care environment. The program combines a broad base of management knowledge with specialized courses in health care administration to permit students to develop the skills necessary for effective leadership.

Bachelor of Arts in Sociology (Endorsed 11-21-06)

The Sociology program at Sojourner-Douglass College provides instruction in the theory and practice in Sociology through a liberal arts and major experience. Students study the interconnectedness of the human experience through courses that examine cultural, economic, political, and ethical contexts of social life. The program leads students to develop critical thinking skills, knowledge and skills in the use of research methodology and the application of sociological theories to social issues. Students are prepared for employment in public and private sectors, in human services, health, corrections, community service, human resources, research and business related fields. The Sociology program with its strong liberal arts content prepares students for graduate study in law, journalism, criminal justice, social work, and other related disciplines.

Bachelor of Science in Information Systems Administration (Endorsed 11-29-06)

The program crosses a broad section of the administrative sciences. The courses are intended to introduce students to principles of programming language, microcomputer applications, database management systems and systems analysis and design. Computer and information systems managers oversee a variety of user services such as an organization's help desk, make hardware and software upgrade recommendations, develop budgets, and schedules. They are employed in management information, as programmers, and project management. Employment in this field ranges from private industry to local and federal government agencies.

Bachelor of Arts in Urban Planning and Community Development (Endorsed 11-29-06) The program is designed to introduce students to communities and their development. It exposes students to various aspects of government planning and administration; looks at neighborhoods and related issues such as transportation; community partnerships; the fundamental components of cities, urban issues; urban cycles; and financial institutions. Graduates of this program are prepared for careers in non-profit organizations, regional and local government, advocacy groups, and agencies and groups involved in planning.

Bachelor of Science in Information Technology (Endorsed 11-29-06)

This program provides the theoretical understanding and technical expertise for the student to successfully develop and manage an organization's technical resources. These resources include logical (software), physical (hardware), human (technical support specialists), and financial (budgets). The program focuses on information (data) as a resource for the organization and the technical tools and processes that can be used to manage, distribute, protect, and insure the integrity of this key asset.

Master of Arts in Political Campaign Management (Endorsed 11-29-06)

A master's in Political Campaign Management prepares the graduates to specialize in the art of winning elections. This program responds to the need for informed and trained persons who are qualified to manage political campaigns. As a graduate, they will be prepared to apply their research and analytical skills to run effective and successful political campaigns.

Public Four-Year Colleges and Universities

Bowie State University

Doctor of Applied Science in Computer Science (Approved 06-21-06) The program will provide graduate level education in computer technologies for those preparing to enter academia or the high-tech skilled workforce and for those planning to enhance their skill level in the chosen area.

Master of Arts in Mental Health Counseling (Approved 06-21-06)

The program courses will facilitate students obtaining necessary counseling skills to function as a professional counselor in the State of Maryland. Upon completion of the program, students will be eligible to apply for a Licensed Graduate Professional Counselor License.

Coppin State University

Bachelor of Science in Allied Health Sciences (Approved 03-22-06)

The program will prepare undergraduates through traditional face-to-face classroom and innovative on-line methods. The degree will provide the academic preparation and experience to meet the privacy needs of the patient and the information exchange needs of the varied healthcare providers.

Frostburg State University

Bachelor of Science in Ethnobotany (Approved 06-15-06)

The interdisciplinary nature of the program will attract a variety of students interested in all aspects of ethnobotany, from ethnopharmacology to folklore. Students interested in pursuing an advanced degree will be well prepared for a variety of programs.

Morgan State University

Doctor of Philosophy and Master of Science in Psychometrics (Approved 02-10-06) The programs are designed to develop individuals who possess analytical and statistical sophistication and the competencies necessary to develop, assess, and evaluate educational, psychological, and other forms of tests and evaluative measures.

Master of Arts in Museum Studies and Historical Preservation with concentrations in: Museum Studies and Historical Preservation and Post-Baccalaureate Certificate in Museum Studies and Historical Preservation (Approved 09-08-06)

The program is designed to meet the informational and training needs of museum professionals and other qualified individuals for advanced museology and/or historical preservation training. The degree provides graduate students with training and credentials to pursue careers in art museums, history museums, historic preservation, cultural resource management, management of historic sites, specialized design practice, and other areas of related work. The program offers both the Master of Arts in Museum Studies and Historical Preservation and the Post-Baccalaureate Certificate in Museum Studies or Historical Preservation.

Salisbury University

Master of Science in Geographic Information Systems and Public Administration (Approved 03-22-06)

The program is designed to enhance the GIS proficiency of professionals working in government, business and non-profit organizations. With proficiency these professionals will be well equipped to integrate and thus use the new technology in their respective fields.

Master of Arts in Conflict Analysis and Dispute Resolution (Approved 03-22-06) The program addresses the local, regional, state, national and international need for highly skilled conflict resolvers to work within judicial, governmental and social service systems, as well as in educational and religious communities. The program empowers students with the knowledge and advanced skills needed to work effectively in these fields.

Towson University

Master of Science in Forensic Science (Approved 02-15-06)

The program is intended for students who are interested in working as forensic scientists in the field. The program is also designed to meet the professional development needs of forensic scientists now employed in Maryland. The program will combine rigorous scientific and laboratory training with exposure to the breadth of forensic science disciplines, including forensic science practice, law enforcement, and ethics.

University of Baltimore

Bachelor of Science in Real Estate and Economic Development (Approved 03-21-06) The program will be unique in Baltimore in that the real estate interest will include both business courses in valuation and marketing areas and an emphasis on land use and governmental processes for real property. The required core of the program will consist of a set of business skill courses and a set of real estate specific courses. Graduates from the real estate program will work in diverse fields, including public and private industry jobs in development, appraisal, and assessment management.

University of Maryland, Baltimore

Doctor of Nursing Practice (Approved 01-25-06)

The DNP program will extend the University's capability to educate nursing leaders by offering a doctoral program to nurses who are not able to commit to the four to five years necessary to earn the research intensive Ph.D. degree. Graduates of the program will be able to lead at the highest educational, clinical, and executive ranks; analyze and apply scientific knowledge and related skills for the highest level of nursing practice; evaluate and apply evidence-based practice for the improvement of education, clinical practice, systems management, and nursing leadership; design, implement, manage, and evaluate organizational systems; and initiate, facilitate and participate in collaborative efforts that influence healthcare outcomes with scholars from other disciplines.

University of Maryland, Baltimore County

Bachelor of Arts in Management of Aging Services (Approved 01-30-06)

This program will prepare undergraduate students for professional careers in aging services management. The program will provide a strong knowledge base on aspects of human aging, the regulatory/policy/fiscal issues involved in providing services, and the basic skills, i.e., accounting, management, for students who will begin their careers in the aging services sector. Students will be equipped for entry-level positions in administration or management in the governmental aging network, the wide array of not-for-profit organizations and advocacy groups, and in the growing for-profit sector of aging services.

Doctor of Philosophy and Master of Science in Human Centered Computing (Approved 06-16-06)

The Ph.D. program will provide a solid, interdisciplinary foundation and develop students through a series of structured apprenticeships toward the independent research of their dissertations. The M.S. program will prepare students for a human-centered computing career in the public or private sector. Common careers in this burgeoning field include user experience engineer, usability engineer, user interface designer, interaction designer, web designer, web services administrator, and human factors specialist. The degree will both provide fundamental knowledge and develop practical skills to ensure successful careers.

University of Maryland, College Park

Doctor of Philosophy in Anthropology (Approved 06-09-06)

The major focus of the program is to direct research scholarship and to encourage theoretical and methodological advancement in such a way as to reflect upon the specific practices of applied and practicing anthropology, with the aim of improving those practices and thereby increasing the value and usefulness of the discipline.

Bachelor of Music Education (Approved 06-28-06)

The program is designed for qualified students who are preparing for careers in K-12 teaching of music. The degree carries with it a teaching certification in either Instrumental Music Education or Choral-General Music Education.

Master of Real Estate Development (Approved 10-26-06)

The interdisciplinary Master of Real Estate Development synthesizes existing course offerings across several disciplines to provide students with the range of tools and skills necessary to undertake complex research issues. Located in the School of Architecture, Planning and Preservation, it would be the only graduate program in real estate development offered by a public university in Maryland. By themselves learning the practical skills and knowledge used by real estate developers, students gain a comprehensive understanding of the motivations, incentives, and interests of the industry, and consequently, better insight into the kind of interventions that can be made to encourage and promote sustainable communities.

University of Maryland Eastern Shore

Bachelor of Arts in History (Approved 12-12-06)

Students who satisfactorily complete the major in History will receive a Bachelor of Arts degree and be prepared to: continue the study of History at the graduate level; enter a school of law, public administration or other professional school to prepare for a career; begin a career in State, county or local government; and with additional preparation, begin a career in the teaching profession.

Bachelor of Science in Professional Golf Management (Approved 12-28-06)

Graduates successfully completing requirements will receive the Bachelor of Science (B.S.) degree in Professional Golf Management and be prepared to: begin a career with a major golf resort or independent golf course operation; assume a supervisory role with a major golf course management company; represent leading golf equipment and golf fashion manufacturers and merchandisers; provide leadership in golf tournament and related special event planning, including banquet or other food and beverage requirements; commence a professional golf teaching career; and obtain membership within The Professional Golfer's Association of America.

University of Maryland University College

Bachelor of Science in Political Science (Approved 03-22-06)

The curriculum focuses on fundamental principles, enduring issues of politics, forms of government, public policy, public law and public administration from domestic and international perspectives and explores political, cultural, and philosophical influences on public policy. The program prepares graduates for careers or career advancement in government service, private corporations, nonprofit organizations, or advanced study in law, business, journalism, or graduate school.

Bachelor of Science in Investigative Forensics (Approved 03-28-06)

The program provides students with a basic foundation in investigative, scientific, and laboratory-based forensics. The degree will expand study and career opportunities for adult and part-time students, including those who may already work in related jobs and wish to advance. In addition, the degree will articulate well with existing community college degrees in Maryland.

Bachelor of Technical and Professional Studies (BTPS) in Laboratory Management (Approved 03-31-06)

The degree is an articulated program between community colleges and UMUC. Students will first complete an Associate's degree in a biology-related or chemistry-related field, and will then complete the necessary coursework at UMUC to complete the requirements for the BTPS degree in Laboratory Management. UMUC has agreed with Montgomery College to articulate its associate of science degrees with a track in chemistry and biochemistry to the BTPS degree. The degree will prepare students to manage and coordinate the non-technical activities that contribute to a safe and well-run biochemical laboratory. The laboratory management major and the expanded curriculum will help meet Maryland's growing demand for scientific technicians in the biotechnology industry.

Community Colleges

Allegany College of Maryland

Statewide Designation to the Lower-Division Certificate in Tree Care Technology (Approved 07-26-06)

The program is designed to prepare students to be professional forestry technicians, which involves maintaining forest reserves, forest harvesting, land surveying, and fighting forest fires.

Anne Arundel Community College

Associate of Arts in Teaching in Secondary Education – Physics (Approved 02-03-06) The AAT in Physics is responsive to the needs of the workforce and community. The AAT in Physics will provide an option for students interested in pursuing a teaching career in a specific content area that is presently experiencing severe shortages. In addition, the AAT in Physics will enhance the transfer process by removing the necessity of configuring course sequences to meet various course requirements of the four-year teacher certification programs.

Associate of Applied Science in Homeland Security Management (Approved 02-06-06) The program addresses various local, national, and global concerns and interests in the area of Homeland Security. Students are provided ample opportunity to reflect and demonstrate learning and skills through guided and independent activities consistent with student-centered learning.

Lower-Division Certificate in Retail Management (Approved 04-17-06)

The program is designed to prepare students with career goals associated with retail management for a successful work experience and to further respond to the workforce needs of the county.

Statewide Designation for the Associate of Applied Science degree in Homeland Security Management (Approved 06-20-06)

The program addresses various local, national, and global concerns and interests in the area of Homeland Security. Students are provided ample opportunity to reflect and demonstrate learning and skills through guided and independent activities consistent with student-centered learning. This specialized technical program meets a growing workforce need in the State and region.

Lower-Division Certificate in Practical Nursing (Approved 08-28-06)

The program is designed to prepare students with career goals in nursing for a successful work experience and to provide students with a pathway to higher levels of credentials in the nursing profession. In addition, the program responds to the workforce needs of the county and State for providers of services to patients at every point on the healthcare spectrum.

Baltimore City Community College

Associate of Applied Science in Environmental Science (Approved 03-06-06) Students in the program will participate in a program that blends both theoretical and practical instruction. Students will engage in activities that include testing, sampling, assisting in the development of policies and procedures, monitoring the effects of environmental pollutants, and understanding emerging issues that affect global change. The program is designed to prepare students for employment in environmental testing/consulting and related industries. Major emphasis is placed on biological and chemical evaluation of man's impact on his environment.

Lower-Division Certificate in Environmental Science (Approved 03-06-06)

Students in the program will participate in a program that blends both theoretical and practical instruction. It is a high quality transfer program that provides the foundational knowledge, skills, and dispositions upon which the receiving colleges of education can build instructional professionals. The AAT in Secondary Education—Chemistry is responsive to the needs of the workforce and community.

Associate of Arts in Teaching in Secondary Education—Spanish (Approved 06-30-06) The program will simplify the advising process by removing the necessity of molding transcripts to meet widely variant course requirements by the four-year institutions. It will be the pathway for students interested in teaching to follow. It is a high quality transfer program that provides the foundational knowledge, skills, and dispositions upon which the receiving colleges of education can build instructional professionals. The AAT in Secondary Education—Spanish is responsive to the needs of the workforce and community.

Cecil Community College

Associate of Arts in Teaching in Early Childhood Education (Approved 03-06-06) The program is a high quality transfer program that provides the foundational knowledge, skills, and dispositions upon which the receiving colleges of education can build instructional professionals. The program will address the major need for early childhood teachers in the region, specifically Cecil County.

Associate of Applied Science in Physical Therapist Assistant (Approved 08-15-06) The program will prepare students to provide selected physical therapy interventions to improve function, relieve pain, promote healing and prevent or limit disabilities for patients, while working under the supervision of a physical therapist. Graduates may work in a variety of settings, including hospitals, physical therapy offices, physicians' offices, out-patient facilities, extended care facilities, and other sites within the community.

Associate of Applied Science in Fire Science Technology (Approved 12/01/06) The program provides instruction in rescue, safety and salvage procedures, hazardous materials, fire behavior, and extinguishment. Students in this program will complete classroom and hands-on training in emergency medical care, basic firefighting operations, the use of firefighting equipment, firefighting company operations, hazardous materials first response, terrorism response, operational planning, and management of personnel and rescue resources. The program will prepare individuals for entry-level employment as fire fighters and provide the degree credential for professionals currently employed with the fire service for promotion and advancement.

Lower-Division Certificate in Instructional Design and Technology (Approved 12-19-06) The certificate is an 18 credit certificate developed to meet the needs of industry partners in the Susquehanna Region who approached the College to develop curriculum that would enhance the expertise of Training and Development Specialists in the development, design, and evaluation of training programs, and in particular, that would integrate the use of technology in instructional delivery.

Chesapeake College

Lower-Division Certificate in Transfer Studies (Approved 06-30-06)

The program is designed for students who intend to transfer to a four-year college or university. The flexible program combines core general education requirements and elective credit to create a certificate program that can be built upon at a four-year college or university. The program is also ideal for those who have not yet determined a major.

Associate of Science in Sport Management (Approved 07-26-06)

The clinical laboratory technician/medical laboratory technician will have responsibilities for information processing, training and quality control monitoring wherever clinical laboratory testing is performed.

X. PROPOSALS NOT APPROVED

College of Southern Maryland

Statewide Designation to the associate degree in Fire Science (02-02-06) Currently, there are six community colleges and two public universities approved to offer certificate and degree programs in fire science, fire management, or fire protection. In addition, Montgomery College's fire science technology degree and certificate programs have statewide designation. Based on the current availability of fire service programs, it was determined that statewide designation was not warranted for another fire science program.

Community College of Baltimore County

Lower-Division Certificate in Introduction to Geospatial Applications (Denied 12-13-06) The program did not meet the minimum credit requirements for a certificate program. The proposed program offered ten credits. COMAR requires a minimum of twelve credits for a certificate program.

Montgomery College

Statewide Designation for the Associate of Applied Science and Certificate in Surgical Technician (Denied 09-29-06)

In Maryland, there are four community colleges approved to offer certificate and degree programs in surgical technology. In addition, surgical technician is not listed among the top demand healthcare occupations identified by either the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene or a study comparing the supply and demand for all healthcare occupations in the State. Based on the current demand for and availability of surgical technology programs, statewide designation is not warranted.

XI. INSTITUTIONAL APPLICATIONS NOT APPROVED

George Mason University

Bachelor of Science in Information Technology (02-03-06)

After completing a review of the program proposal to operate as an authorized out-ofstate postsecondary institution in Maryland, offering the B. S. in Information Technology degree at the Southern Maryland Higher Education Center, it was determined that the University did not demonstrate need for the degree in Southern Maryland.
