Janet L. Hoffman Loan Assistance Repayment Program 2004 Fiscal Year Report

By law, the Maryland Higher Education Commission is required to report annually to the General Assembly on the status of the Janet L. Hoffman Loan Assistance Repayment Program (LARP).

Listed below are the LARP priority fields of employment:

- 1. Lawyers who provide legal services to low-income residents of Maryland (mandated by law);
- 2. Nurses in nursing shortage areas, as defined by the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (mandated by law);
- 3. Occupational and physical therapists;
- 4. Social workers with a Bachelor's or Master's degree in social work;
- 5. Physician's Assistants
- 6. Speech pathologists; and
- 7. Teachers in declared areas of critical teacher shortage in Maryland. Those areas for 2003-2004 were: mathematics, physics, physical science, computer science, earth/space science, technology education, chemistry (all secondary); English for speakers of other languages/ESOL (elementary and secondary); Foreign language of Spanish and special education generic (infant to Grade 3; Grade 6 to adult hearing impaired), and severely and profoundly handicapped.

LARP applications were available in June 2003, and were accepted until September 30, 2003. The Office of Student Financial Assistance received 321 applications. Of the 321 applications received, 19 were incomplete, 47 showed no need for assistance, and 27 were ineligible for consideration. Of the 224 eligible applicants, 139 received awards for a total dollar amount of \$401,094. Of the 139 that received awards, 57 were renewals.
