Janet L. Hoffman Loan Assistance Repayment Program 2015 Fiscal Year Report

In accordance with §18-1505 of the Education Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, the Maryland Higher Education Commission shall report to the General Assembly "on the implementation of the Janet L. Hoffman Loan Assistance Repayment Program (LARP)."

Listed below are the LARP priority fields of employment:

- 1. Lawyers who provide legal services to low-income residents of Maryland (mandated by law);
- 2. Nurses in nursing shortage areas, as defined by the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (mandated by law);
- 3. Nurse faculty members
- 4. Occupational and physical therapists;
- 5. Social workers with a Bachelor's or Master's degree in social work;
- 6. Physician's Assistants
- 7. Licensed Clinical Counselors
- 8. Speech pathologists
- 9. Teachers in declared areas of critical teacher shortage in Maryland. Those areas for 2014-2015 were: Technology Education (secondary), Chemistry (secondary), Computer Science (secondary), English for Speakers of Other Languages-ESOL (elementary and secondary), Physics (secondary), Earth/Space Science (secondary), Physical Science (secondary), Spanish, German, Italian, Japanese, Latin (secondary), Special Education: Generic Infant to Grade 3; Grades 1 through 8; Grades 6 to Adult; Hearing Impaired; Severely & Profoundly Disabled; Visually Impaired.
- 10. Teachers at any level or subject field who teach in schools designated as Federal Title 1 or Schools Identified for Improvement by the Maryland State Department of Education; and
- 11. Nancy Grasmick Teacher Award
 - a. In addition to the general eligibility requirements, to be eligible for a Nancy Grasmick Teacher Award, the applicant must have
 - i. Taught in public school in the State for at least 2 years:
 - 1. In science, technology, engineering, or math subjects; or

2. In a school in which at least 75% of the students are enrolled in the free and reduced lunch program in the State for 2 years; and Received the highest performance evaluation rating for the most recent year available in the county in which the teacher taught

LARP applications were available in July 2014, and were accepted until September 30, 2014; however renewal applicants had an extended deadline of October 17, 2014 due to a system error. The Office of Student Financial Assistance received 344 complete applications, 306 incomplete applications and 81 ineligible applications. One hundred and seventy (170) eligible applicants were offered awards; one eligible applicant declined their award; 169 awards were processed for payment; 174 applicants were placed on the waitlist.
