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Janet L. Hoffman Loan Assistance Repayment Program 2021 Fiscal Year Report MSAR #11700/11701

By law, the Maryland Higher Education Commission is required to report on the status of the Janet L. Hoffman Loan Assistance Repayment Program (LARP) annually to the General Assembly.

Listed below are the LARP priority fields of employment:

- 1. Lawyers who provide legal services to low-income residents of Maryland (mandated by law);
- 2. Nurses in nursing shortage areas, as defined by the Maryland Department of Health (MDH) (mandated by law);
- 3. Nurse faculty members;
- 4. Occupational and physical therapists;
- 5. Social workers with a Bachelor's or Master's degree in social work;
- 6. Physician's Assistants;
- 7. Licensed Clinical Counselors;
- 8. Speech Pathologists;
- 9. Teachers in declared areas of critical teacher shortage in Maryland. Those areas for 2020-2021 were: Technology Education (secondary), Chemistry (secondary), Computer Science (secondary), English for Speakers of Other Languages-ESOL (elementary and secondary), Physics (secondary), Earth/Space Science (secondary), Physical Science (secondary), Spanish, German, Italian, Japanese, Latin (secondary), Special Education: Generic Infant to Grade 3; Grades 1 through 8; Grades 6 to Adult; Hearing Impaired; Severely & Profoundly Disabled; Visually Impaired;
- 10. Teachers at any level or subject field who teach in schools designated as Federal Title 1 or Schools Identified for Improvement by the Maryland State Department of Education; and
- 11. Nancy Grasmick Teacher Award.

In addition to the general eligibility requirements, to be eligible for a Nancy Grasmick Teacher Award, the applicant must have

Taught in public school in the State for at least 2 years:

In science, technology, engineering, or math subjects; or

In a school in which at least 75% of the students are enrolled in the free and reduced lunch program in the State for 2 years; and

Received the highest performance evaluation rating for the most recent year available in the county in which the teacher taught.

LARP applications were available in September 2020 and were accepted until November 30, 2020. The Office of Student Financial Assistance (OSFA) received 91 complete and eligible applications, 182 incomplete applications, and 49 ineligible applications. Seventy-four (74) eligible applicants were offered awards and were processed for payment; no applicants were placed on the waiting list.

Table 1 shows the award type, number of awards made/disbursed and the award year(s) that the applicant is eligible to receive the award.
