# Maryland's Public Charter Schools Report to the Maryland General Assembly Under Title 9, Subtitle 1 of the Education Article

Maryland State Department of Education December 1, 2018

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#### **Background**

The Maryland Public Charter School Program is governed by Title 9, Subtitle 1 of the Education Article the Annotated Code of Maryland. The statute requires the Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) to report annually to the Maryland General Assembly regarding any updates or amendments made to public charter school policies by local school systems as well as the and implementation of the Maryland Public Charter School Program on or before December 1 of each year.

In addition to the requirements of the statute, this report provides the Governor and the Maryland General Assembly a general overview of Maryland's charter schools. The report includes:

- A summary of information about Maryland's Charter Schools, including enrollment and demographics;
- A review of existing local policies as required by § 9-110(a) and § 9-110(c)(1) and the availability of those polices on local school system websites as required by § 9-110(a)(3);
- A summary of technical assistance provided by the Office of School Innovation in the Division of Student Services, Academic Enrichment, and Educational Policy;
- An update on implementation of Education Article, Title 9; and
- An update on the Charter Schools Program grant awarded to the MSDE to support the growth of public charter schools.

# Overview of Maryland's charter schools

#### History

The Maryland General Assembly enacted the Maryland Charter School Program in 2003, "to establish an alternative means within the existing public school system in order to provide innovative learning opportunities and creative educational approaches to improve the education of students." [§ 9-101 (b)].

The key provisions of the Maryland Charter School Law include:

- Local School Boards are the authorizers of public charter schools;
- Public Charter Schools comply with all State and local education laws and policies, unless waived:
- Employees of public charter schools are employees of the local school system;
- Charter schools receive an amount of public funding that is commensurate with the amount of funding expended on behalf of all public school students; and
- Charter schools are open to all students. Admission is by lottery.

In the 2015 session, the Maryland General Assembly added provisions that allow local school boards to approve proposals that would give greater weight in a lottery to disadvantaged students. In addition, under the revisions to the statute, the Maryland State Board of Education (MSBE) was directed to establish criteria by which the local school board will assess charter schools to be eligible for additional operational autonomy. The MSBE approved guidance for this provision in December 2016.





Figure 2. Enrollment of Maryland local school systems and Maryland charter schools

In the 2017-2018 school year, 50 public charter schools served over 23,000 (2.4 percent) of Maryland public school students in five local school systems within Maryland. There are 34 public charter schools in Baltimore City, 10 public charter schools in Prince George's County, three in Frederick County, two in Anne Arundel County, and one in St. Mary's County. Figure 1 shows the number of charter schools and charter school enrollment by year. Figure 2 shows the total number of students in public charter schools relative to the enrollment of Maryland's local school systems for 2017, the last year for which validated data is available.

The number of students that sought enrollment in a charter school in 2017 totaled 19,956. This represents the number of applicants seeking 4,109 available seats.

**Note:** Monocacy Valley Public Charter School was approved by the Frederick County School Board in 2001, before passage in 2004 of Maryland's Charter Law.

#### **Renewal and Applications**

During the 2017-2018 school year, 18 public charter schools completed a contract renewal review with their local board of education. All of the schools were renewed. Two charter schools will be evaluated in the next year to determine progress on corrective actions required by the authorizer.

In addition, Baltimore City reviewed six applications for new charter schools in the 2017-2018 school year. One school was approved for a replication of an existing charter school. Two of the school teams that were declined have appealed this decision to the Maryland State Board of Education. On October 23, 2018, the State Board acted on one of the appeals, reversing and remanding the decision of the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners. In March 2018, Baltimore County reviewed one application which the Baltimore County School Board declined. On September 25, 2018, the State Board reversed this decision. Prince George's County Schools has one application under review.

#### **Demographics**

Maryland's public charter schools serve a diverse array of students. Table 2 provides the percentage of students attending public charter schools who are eligible for Free and Reduced Price Meals (FARMS) and the percentage of students with disabilities (SWD). Cumulatively, for each grade band, the percentage of students in public charter schools who are eligible for FARMS is greater than that of the State. In Baltimore City, the percent of students eligible for FARMS and the percent of SWD are comparable. Outside of Baltimore City, a lower percentage of students eligible for FARMS or who have disabilities attend charter schools than traditional schools in the local school system.

Additional data is provided in the appendix. Table A provides the percentage of students scoring 4 or 5 on the PARCC assessments for math, English/language arts, and Algebra 1. Data is provided for the All Students group and for students eligible for Free and Reduced Price Meals.

### Review of existing local policies [9-110(a)] [9-110(c)(1)]

The State law requires that each local school system adopt a charter schools policy, post the policy to the local school system website, and provide the policy to the MSDE. In addition, each local school system is to name a charter school liaison.

After passage of the Maryland Charter Law in 2003, each local school system adopted a charter school policy. In a review of every local school system policy, the MSDE found that all had adapted the model policy. Each contains the key elements including a definition of a public charter school, eligibility requirements for operators of charter schools, an overview of the local school system process for evaluation of applications to operate charter schools, and the process for earning a renewal of the charter. In most cases, the initial term of a charter contract is five years and renewal terms are three or five years. In two counties, the initial terms are three and four years. To date, no initial contract terms are longer than five years.

Table 5 is a summary for each local school system and their adherence to the requirements of the law. The MSDE reviews websites annually.

# Technical assistance provided [9-110(b)(2)(i)]

Maryland State Department of Education's Director for the Office of School Innovations meets with the local school system liaisons six times a year. Attendance includes representatives from local school systems with and without operating charter schools. The meetings provide a forum

for collaborative review of aspects of the charter law and challenges that arise in overseeing charter schools. This stakeholder group has provided input into the development of standards by which a local school board will determine a charter school "eligible" for additional operational flexibility, in accordance with § 9-104.1.

The MSDE regularly responds to requests for information and technical assistance from local school systems, charter school operators, and the public. Inquiries include questions from potential operators seeking guidance on the application process and parents seeking information about charter school enrollment.

Topics addressed with local school system representatives in the past year include the following:

- Application of the eligibility provision of § 9-104.1
- Implementation of a weighted lottery
- Review of per pupil calculations
- Guidance for potential charter school applicants

As part of the Charter Schools Program Grant of the U.S. Department of Education described below, the MSDE contracted with SchoolsWorks, Inc. to review policies and practices of Maryland's local school systems with operating charter schools, interview local school system staff, and propose and implement technical assistance for all local school systems staff with responsibility for authorizing public charter schools. One outcome of the project will be a shared web-based resource of sample documents for all local school system authorizing staff.

# **U.S Department of Education Charter Schools Program Grant**

In September 2017, the MSDE was awarded a grant from the U.S. Department of Education (USED) Charter Schools Program. For this competitive award process 21 state agencies or other entities applied. Nine awards were made. The MSDE received previous grants in this program in 2004 and 2007. The initial award of the USED Charter Schools Program Grant is \$5,490,859 for a two year period, October 1, 2017 through September 30, 2019. The total award is \$17,222,222 over five years through September 30, 2022. Grants for years three through five will be dependent on federal appropriations.

There are three areas of activities that will be launched with the grant.

<u>Subgrants</u>: Ninety percent of the funding will be awarded in subgrants to nonprofit organizations operating or seeking to operate public charter schools in Maryland. The grants are available for the start-up costs of new, expanding, or replicating charter schools that have been approved by the local board of education. Sub grants are awarded on a competitive basis. The MSDE projects three rounds of grant awards, and approximately 17 awards.

Typically, there is a year of planning between approval of a charter school and opening. Charter school operators will propose plans for the planning year and initial one to two years of operation. Activities supported by the grant may include recruitment, planning, professional development, marketing, and technology acquisition.

The MSDE released its first Request for Applications in May, 2018.

The first applications for subgrants were reviewed in July and August of 2018. Eight applications were scored by peer reviewers with expertise in education and nonprofit management. The school teams were interviewed. Of these, six were awarded grants. The first awards were announced in September 2018.

#### The new grantees are:

- Chesapeake Charter School, St. Mary's County: To add 170 new students to its current K-8 program focusing on project based learning and arts integration.
- Baltimore International Academy, Baltimore City: To replicate its existing K-8 program emphasizing language immersion in another Baltimore neighborhood.
- Watershed School, Baltimore County: To launch a new elementary school in 2019-2020 with an environmental focus and extensive community outreach.
- DaVinci Collaborative School, Baltimore City: To start a new high school targeting internships and an intensive advisory model.
- Legends Charter School, Prince George's County: To open a new K-4 school with an intention of expanding to K-8, focusing on financial literacy and entrepreneurship.
- Chesapeake Math and IT Academy, Prince George's County: To replicate its STEM-based school model, which is currently successful at three locations in the county.

<u>Technical Assistance:</u> Technical Assistance activities will be developed to support the expansion, replication or creation of high quality public charter schools. Current and new charter operators will be offered assistance to determine readiness for replication or to launch a school, strategic planning, and addressing the needs of all students.

Local school system authorizers will also benefit from technical assistance and professional development opportunities to help ensure that application and renewal processes are equitable and rigorous. For example, local school systems will review Maryland's new accountability system for all public schools to determine whether there should be changes to the standards used to evaluate a charter school for renewal.

<u>Sharing and Collaboration</u>: The MSDE will support local school system authorizers in identifying and disseminating promising practices public charter schools. The project will include a statewide conference in year three (Fiscal Year 2020) to highlight practice sharing among charter schools and traditionally-managed schools.
