Dear Ms. Gruber:

Section 3 of Chapter 55 of the Acts of 2021 (HB1372) requires local school systems to report to the Accountability and Implementation Board, the Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE), and the Department of Legislative Services on how the county board will spend any Blueprint for Maryland's Future funding retained in fiscal year 2022. The reports were due by July 1, 2021.
