RE: <u>Joint Chairmen's Report – Local Jails and Detention Centers</u>
Population Statistics Report

Dear Chairman Kasemeyer and Chairman Conway:

The 2012 Joint Chairmen's Report requires the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services to submit a report pertaining to the population statistics of the local jails and detention centers since the Department oversees the local jail and detention centers Capital Improvement Program. The following language requirements can be found on pages 264-265 of the 2012 Joint Chairmen's Report:

Jails and Detention Centers Population Statistics Report: As overseer of the Local Jails and Detention Center Capital Improvement Program, the committees direct the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services (DPSCS), on an annual basis, to coordinate the submission of local jail and detention center population statistics on behalf of the counties and provide that information in a report to the budget committees. At a minimum the report shall include:

- the operational capacity for each facility, making note of specialized population beds which cannot be used by general population inmates;
- the total average daily population for the fiscal year for total population and separated by male and female offenders;
- the number of days the population exceeded operational capacity;
- the most consecutive days the population exceeded capacity;
- the range in the number of inmates exceeding operational capacity;
- the average amount the population exceeded capacity; and
- the peak inmate population.

Receipt of this information for every county on an annual basis would allow the General Assembly, the Department of Budget and Management, DPSCS, and the counties to better assess local jails and detention centers capital needs. The report shall be submitted to the budget committees no later than September 1, 2010, and annually thereafter. The attached chart was the best format to display the collected statistical information so the local county jails and detention centers information can be viewed and compared. If this format is not deemed appropriate, the Department would be more than glad to recreate a format for viewing the information.

I hope this letter and attached chart meet with your approval and fulfills the requirements of the Joint Chairmen's Report. If the Department or I can be of further assistance, please do not hesitate to contact me.
