Non-compliant units were contacted by the Division of State Documents as a courtesy, with the following results:

The Department of Agriculture, the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation, and the Board of Public Works were aware of the requirements but had forgotten to post the regulations on their websites.

The Department of Budget and Management, the Department of Education, and the Department of Human Resources had not been made aware of the requirements of SB 253 by their legislative offices and are working to get those regulations posted.

The Department of the Environment did not have the correct link to their regulations and is working to correct that problem.
